1. Engaging and Supporting All Students In Learning
2. Creating and Maintaining Effective Environments for Student Learning
3. Understanding and Organizing Subject Matter for Student Learning
4. Planning Instruction and Designing Learning Experiences for All Students

6. Developing as a Professional Educator



Coursework

Pre-service courses are required and available through MCOE - Intern coursework includes a minimum of 34 credits.

Individualized Intern Plan

Candidates complete an Individualized Intern Plan comprised of goals and action plans based upon the California Teacher Performance Expectations.

Professional Learning Hours

A minimum of 144 hours of general support, mentoring and supervision is provided to each intern per school year. Support includes coaching, modeling, assistance with course planning and problem-solving.

Collaborative Coaching

Candidates meet with their supervisors a minimum of two hours weekly. Coaching sessions are confidential and provide job-embedded support.

Completion

Upon approval, MCOE validates the completion of the Education Specialist Intern Program and assists the candidate in obtaining a preliminary or clear credential.

What is the cost of the program?

The program costs \$9,000 (\$4,500 for each of the two years). Payment options are available, please contact the program administrator for complete details.

How is my Supervisor selected?

Qualified site-based supervisors are matched to candidates by experience and geographical proximity. Your practicum supervisor will be provided by MCOE.

I have a teaching credential and want a Special Ed Credential?

Holders of a valid multiple or single subject credential may be exempt from certain classes.
