Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is an educational framework based on research in the learning sciences and cognitive neuroscience that guides the development of flexible educational environments. Recognizing that the way individuals learn can be unique. The UDL framework calls for creating curricula that nurtures individual learners.

- Learn about the 3 principles of UDL (Representation, Action/Expression, Engagement)
