Vision: The Seal of Biliteracy inspires students to develop multilingual skills to better understand different cultural and linguistic populations and see the potential economic rewards in a global society.

What is Multiliteracy? Multiliteracy is the ability to be socially and academically literate with all modes of communication in multiple languages.

What is the Seal of Biliteracy?

The Merced County Seal of Biliteracy is an award given by the Merced County Office of Education in partnership with school districts in recognition of attained proficiency in English and at least one other world language by high school graduation. Appearing on the transcript of the graduating senior, the Seal of Biliteracy is a verification of linguistic proficiencies.
