- A. California School 2022 Dashboard Presentation: Laura Andrews provided an informational report on the Dashboard new release data coming out this year.
- B. Report on Attendance of MCSBA Fall Conference: Dennis Hanks reported the sessions were good. He appreciated the session that Matthew Navo presented on "Collaborative Leadership for an Educational Future we Can't Predict" and how we are in it for the long haul. Geneva Brett also enjoyed the sessions. She was glad to see that sixteen Merced County School Districts were represented at the conference. Frank Fagundes learned from the "Record Heat, Fires and Freezes: Preparing Your District to Weather the Storm" session that there are a lot more mandates required. Steve Tietjen was relieved to hear from Kevin Gordon and Jack O'Connell of Capitol Advisors Group, that the State revenue is going down but it is not a cliff, like years before and although inflation is up the COLA should be stronger next year.

Board Member's Report (*if any*): Geneva Brett reported that she attended the Valley Community School Los Banos welcome back event and learned that one of the teachers organized a community closet to provide donated clothing for interviews. Geneva will collect and donate necessities items, such as miniature soaps/shampoos/deodorants.

Appointee shall be seated at the organizational meeting (December 12, 2022) of the board as if elected at a district election.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the nominee; **Dennis Hanks**, **Trustee Area 1**, as Appointment Members Due to Failure to Elect of the Merced County Board of Education pursuant Education Code 5326 and 5328.

Appointee shall be seated at the organizational meeting (December 12, 2022) of the board as if elected at a district election.

### Resolution No. 2022-40

### RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE MERCED COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION SUPPORT OF THE 1300 CAMPAIGN

- **WHEREAS,** young men of color possess extraordinary academic potential but continue to be the students least likely to graduate high school, complete the A-G requirements, and attend a four-year college; and
- **WHEREAS,** given the historical barriers that exist for young men of color to achieve their full academic potential, legislative bodies must not only recognize the challenges but implement policies to improve academic achievement; and
- *WHEREAS,* the 1300 Campaign was created to work with school districts and local governments to send an additional 1300 young men of color to Stanislaus State and University of California, Merced by 2026; and
- **WHEREAS,** the 1300 Campaign seeks to work with school districts to incorporate the A-G requirements as a default curriculum for all students. This will help ensure that all graduates, particularly young men of color, are eligible for post-secondary options. A-G eligibility for all students addresses a systematic barrier to college that contributes to the divergence in educational outcomes, particularly for young men of color; and
- *NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED* that the Merced County Board of Education joins the Merced County Superintendent of Schools in supporting this priority of the 1300 Campaign; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this resolution be distributed to all Merced County School Districts.
